Dickson Baptist Church

Peter and his wife Michelle, who currently serve at Southwestern Community Baptist Church in Sydney, will commence on Sunday September 19.

Whilst the conclusion of Lyn's ministry has been felt by church, God has still been at work and we have much to celebrate and be thankful for.

In March, 50 young adults attended a terrific camp at Jindabyne. Our topic was 'Amazing Grace' and this was a great time of fellowship, encouragement and spiritual growth. Between April and July we have witnessed 7 baptisms – Praise God!

At the start of May, we commenced a 6-week sermon series entitled 'My Shepherd', during which we walked through one of the most loved and yet often overlooked Psalms of Scripture, Psalm 23. It was a time of healing, celebration and growth as each week we expounded and explored the rich imagery and significance of this beautiful poem. We were reminded that Jesus is our shepherd and that by keeping our eyes fixed on him, he will lead and guide us through every season of life.

In June, we held a special event at a local café, Deli Marco, where musicians Jess and Daniel Hammond from Melbourne came and shared the gospel through song. It was a sell-out with over 50 people hearing the good news proclaimed, many not from the church.

Two important ministries, the Care Ministry and our Community Outreach and Evangelism Ministry, have recently undergone a process of rethinking and revisioning their purpose, and have been commissioned and re-launched during our services with great support and enthusiasm from the community.

'Christianity Explored' has just begun for those new to the faith or wanting to explore a little more about what it means to follow Jesus. 13 men from DBC attended the Baptist Men's Retreat in July which was a great time of blessing and encouragement, and starting in mid-August, 15 couples will be significantly enriched by attending the Marriage Course that one of our Bible Study groups has kindly offered to lead.

It is with trust and hope that we place an uncertain future into the hands of a certain God.
